

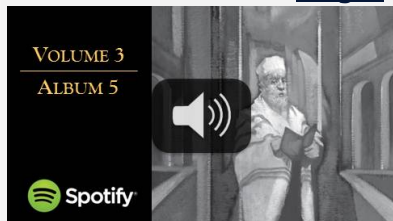
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With Liberty and Worship Options for All

Though the *mussaf* service is a separate entity and can be said any time between the *shaharit* (morning) and *minḥa* (afternoon) services, it is generally attached to the morning service as part of a single, extended service. There are slight variations in the order of the *mussaf* service on Holy Days and Festivals. In the case of Rosh Hashanah, there are three blessings in the amidah section—*Malkhuyot* (God's sovereignty), *Zikhronot* (memories), and *Shofarot* (shofar blasts)—which each contain ten biblical texts.

The version of the *mussaf* service recorded by the Milken Archive combines traditional motifs and melodies with interpretations, variations, and extensions that have been devised by some of the 20th century's most influential cantors. In service of the musical delivery are some of our own age's golden voices. Led by Cantor Alberto Mizrahi, the recording features stunning choral arrangements created and conducted by Neil W. Levin and rendered by the New York Cantorial Choir. Magda Fishman and Shayna Smith are among the featured soloists.
